Our eight **Research Advisory Committees** (RACs) represent each

Northern Territory. They provide
advice on priorities and needs
relevant to the public good and for
sectors not covered under IPAs.

FRDC also involves the Indigenous Reference Group and the Australian Recreational Fishing Foundation in all representational organisation activities.
