Pre course Publicity.

The Fisheries Information Service of the NSW Department of Agriculture & Fisheries prepared printed and distributed publicity posters and application forms to the Sydney Fish Markets, Fisheries Inspectors' Office and the premises of local fishermen's Co-operatives. About 3000 application forms were mailed to individual fishermen.

Dates & Venue of courses.

Net Making 23rd - 27th May 1988
Echosounder 30th May - 3rd June 1988.

Both courses were held at the Gore Cove Depot of the NSW Department of Agriculture & Fisheries. The courses were held in consecutive weeks to allow participants to attend both without the added costs of returning home between courses.

Number of Participants.

The number at the net making course was increased again this year from 14 to 15. The additional participant was funded by the NSW Division of Fisheries.

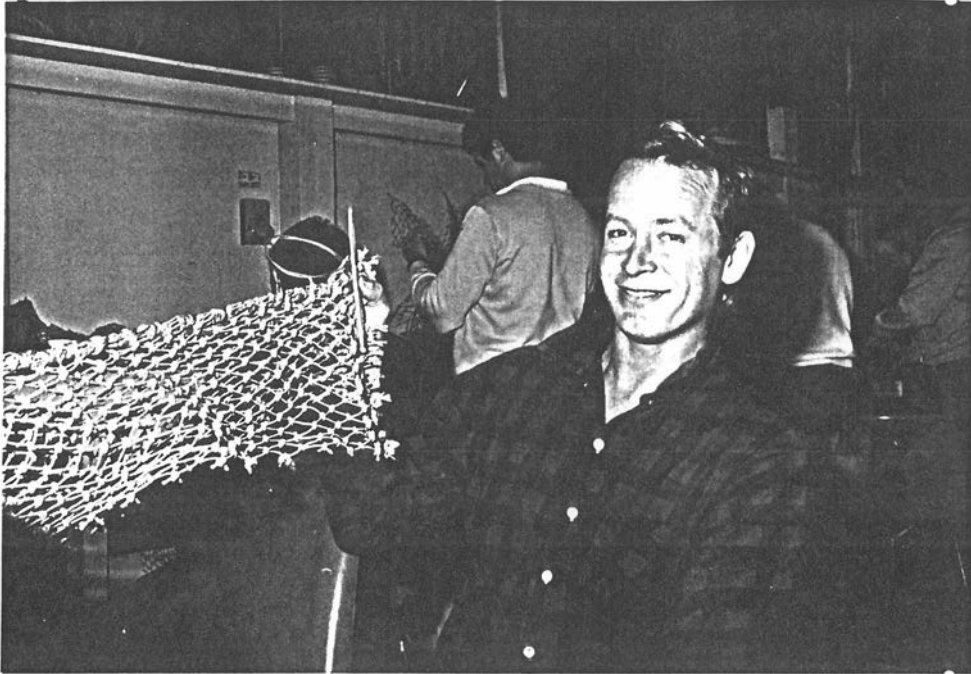

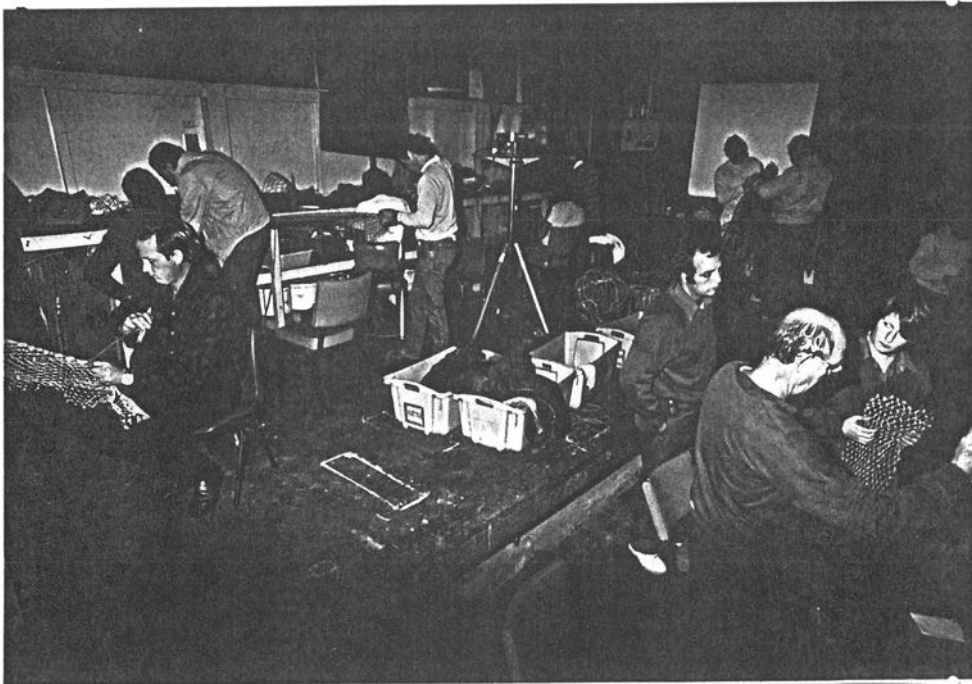

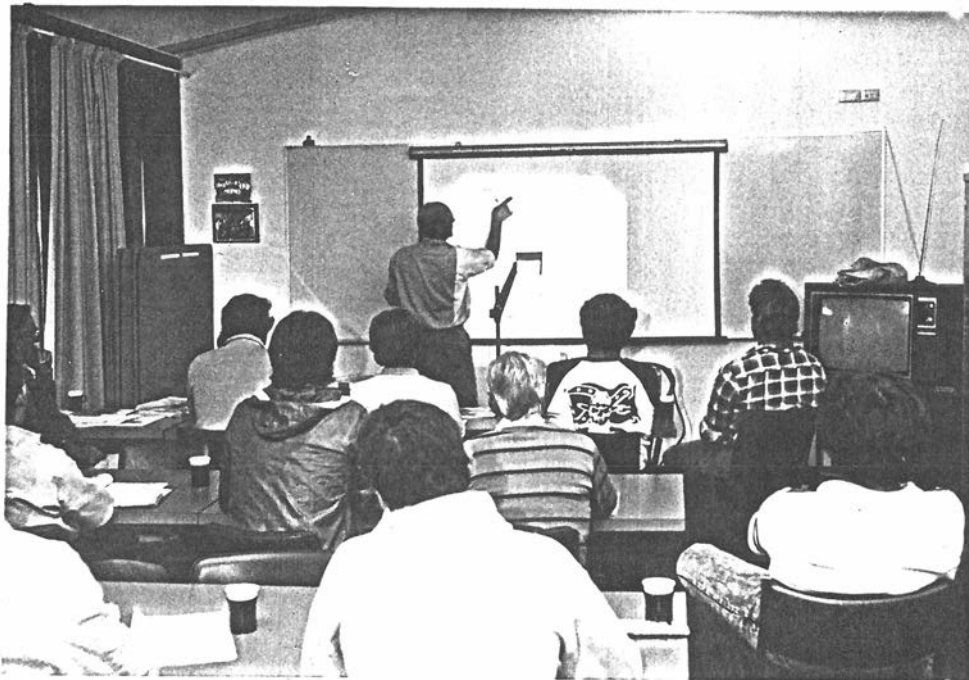

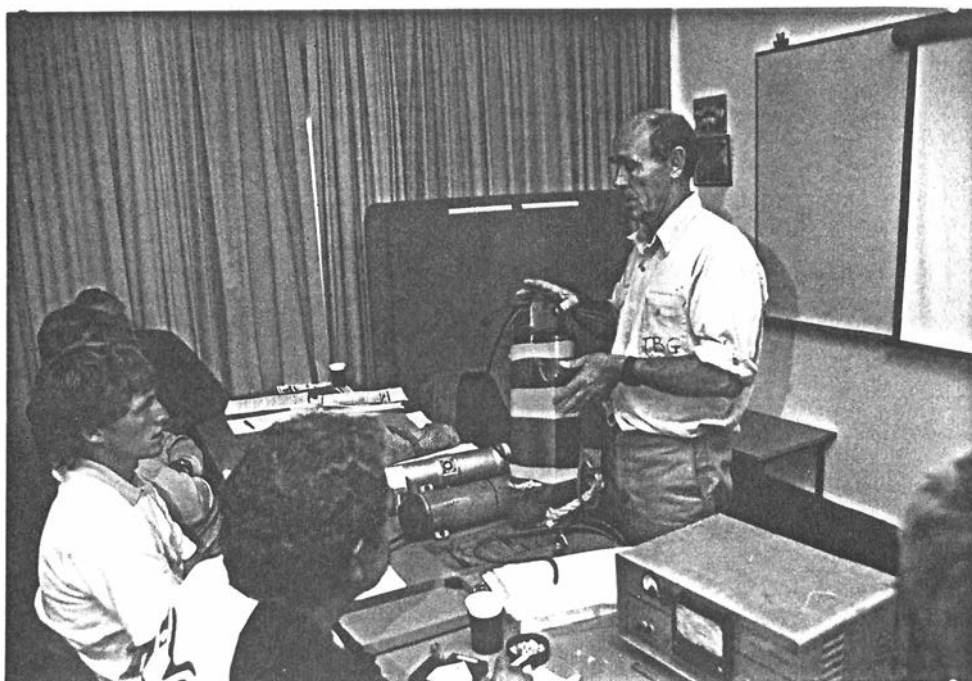
